Radiant Reflections with Paster Temaris

Week of December 22, 2024

### Fourth Week of Advent

5 - Day Devotional

### **Devotional Summary:**

This week's devotional has taken us on a journey through Hebrews 10:5-10, where we've explored the profound themes of preparation, obedience, inadequacy of the old sacrifices, sanctification, and reflecting Christ's love. As we conclude this Advent season, let us carry forward the deep appreciation of Christ's perfect sacrifice and strive to embody His love in every aspect of our lives, celebrating the joy and completeness it brings.

### Day 1: Preparation for Sacrifice

Scripture: Hebrews 10:5

**Reflection:** Christ's coming into the world was an act of intentional preparation and divine purpose. Reflect on the significance of God preparing a body for Christ and what it means for the concept of sacrifice.

**Prayer:** Lord, thank You for the preparation that made the way for our salvation. Help me to understand and appreciate the depth of Your planning and love.

**Action Step:** Spend time today meditating on the incarnation of Christ and journal about how this act of divine preparation demonstrates God's love for you.

### Day 2: The Will to Obey

Scripture: Hebrews 10:7

**Reflection:** Jesus embraced God's will fully, knowing it led to His sacrifice. Consider areas in your life where you struggle to submit to God's will. How does understanding Christ's obedience inspire you to obey?

**Prayer:** Father, grant me the courage to embrace Your will for my life, as Jesus did, trusting in Your love and wisdom.

**Action Step:** Identify one area where you can better align your will with God's. Commit to taking a step of obedience in that area today.

### Day 3: The Inadequacy of Old Sacrifices

Scripture: Hebrews 10:8-9

**Reflection**: The old sacrifices were not enough to fully reconcile humanity with God. How does Jesus' sacrifice, as the fulfillment of God's will, change the way you view atonement and reconciliation?

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, thank You for fulfilling what was insufficient in the old covenant and establishing a new way through Your sacrifice.

**Action Step:** Reflect on the difference between external religious acts and internal spiritual transformation. Share your thoughts with a friend or mentor.

### Day 4: Sanctified Through the Offering

Scripture: Hebrews 10:10

**Reflection:** Through Jesus' sacrifice, we are made holy—set apart for God's purposes. How does this truth affect your identity and your daily living?

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, help me to live out the reality of the holiness imparted to me through Christ's sacrifice. May my life reflect Your love and grace.

**Action Step:** Consider ways you can live out your sanctification in practical terms at home, work, or in your community. Implement one of these ways today.

### Day 5: Reflecting Perfect Love in Our Lives

Scripture: Hebrews 10:5-10

**Reflection:** Christ's sacrifice was a perfect act of love, intended not just to save us but to model perfect love. How can you mirror this love in your relationships and interactions?

**Prayer:** Lord, let Your perfect love overflow from my life. Teach me to love others as Christ loves me—sacrificially and unconditionally.

**Action Step:** Choose one relationship where you can more actively demonstrate Christ-like love. Make a specific plan to show love to this person in a sacrificial way this week.
