Easter Preview

Easter falls on April 20th this year. While that seems late, it's not the latest Easter can be. Did you know that Easter can be anytime from March 22nd through April 25th? Here's a bit of trivia: Easter is on the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs on or after the first day of spring. Ash Wednesday is 46 days before Easter, so that date also moves and it can fall from February 4th through March 10th. This year, Ash Wednesday is this week, March 5th. Although Ash Wednesday is 46 days before Easter and marks the start of Lent, Lent is only 40 days. That's because Sundays aren't counted in the 40 days.

Look for the Easter flower order form and the memorial donation form in a few weeks. We will have the form in the back of the sanctuary and will also send it out electronically with the bulletin. Easter flowers will adorn our altar rail on Easter Sunday and a list will be included in the bulletin of the dedications.

We will be holding our annual Easter Sunrise Service at the Burlington City Waterfront followed by a delicious breakfast (with hot coffee, of course).

A Note from the Counting Committee

Almost everything is more expensive than it used to be, and that includes checks. If you make your donations to the church using checks, remember that you can include donations for multiple things in one check and one weekly envelope and write fewer checks. For example, if you were making your weekly donation on the first Sunday and also wanted to donate to the communion offering and a bulletin dedication, you could write one check for all three things. You would then write on your offering envelope on the first line for weekly tithes/offerings the amount you're donating for that. Then on the next line, write "\$x/communion; \$10/bulletin dedication for 3/17/25." It will all be tracked properly that way and you only write one check.

Bulletin Dedications

As you know, we discontinued having fresh flowers weekly on the altar last July. If you would like to purchase and bring them in, you are welcome to do so (Steins on Sunset is a good florist choice as they know the size we need). Just let the Worship Committee know the week before so your dedication can be in the bulletin. Susan Curlett has been creating the beautiful flower arrangements that are on our altar and we thank her for the wonderful job she's doing with them!

We are still having bulletin dedications weekly, however. The cost is \$10 to dedicate the bulletin and you can dedicate it in memory or honor of a loved one, a pet, a holiday, a group—whatever you'd like.

At the moment, most Sundays in 2025 are available. The cost to dedicate the bulletin is \$10. Bulletin dedication forms are available in the back of the sanctuary. If you'd like to dedicate for a particular week, fill out the form and return it to the church office (via the offering plate is fine) with your \$10 donation. You can include your payment in your weekly offering envelope – just mark the envelope on the 'other' line that you are including the bulletin dedication amount of \$10 for xx/xx date.

If your requested week is already taken we will let you know and we'll offer alternatives.

Thank you to everyone who submitted a devotional (or more than one) for our Lenten devotional booklet. We will hand out the booklets next Sunday, the first Sunday in Lent. We can accept final submissions today. We can't wait to read your stories!

The Burlington Entertainers


